- 1. Foothill (noun) A low hill at the foot of higher hills or mountains. तलहटी/ ਜਿਧलੀ पहाड़ी
- 2. **Fellow** (adjective) mate, dude, buddy, companion, comrade साथी
- 3. Shout (verb) Utter in a loud voice; talk in a loud voice चिल्लाना
- Joy (noun) happiness, delight, ecstasy, pleasure, bliss आनंद/ खुशी
- 5. Shoot (verb) hit, fire off मारना
- Marble (noun) a small ball of glass that is used in various games लड़कों के खेलने की गोली
- 7. Idle away (phrasal verb) to spend a period of time relaxing and doing very little समय बर्बाद करना
- 8. Fence (noun) a structure of wood or wire forming a wall around a house or a piece of land, often to keep people or animals from coming in or going out बाड़, घेरा
- 9. Fall to pieces (phrasal verb) to break apart into smaller parts: disintegrate ट्कड़ों में गिरना
- 10. **Astray** (adverb) away from the correct path or direction भटकना

- 11. Weed (noun) wild plant that grows in an unwanted place खरपतवार
- 12. **Constant** (adjective) persistent, steady, perpetual, consistent निरंतर/स्थिर
- 13. **Companion** (noun) buddy, friend, comrade, mate, fellow साथी
- 14. **On and on** (phrase) Continuously and perpetually, without stopping. लगातार
- 15. **Climb** (noun) –the act of climbing something; rise, mount चढ़ाई
- 16. **Lie down** (phrasal verb) a short rest in which one lies down on a bed लेटना
- 17. **Call out** (phrasal verb) to say something in a loud voice: ब्लाना
- 18. Look around (phrasal verb) to go through a place in order to see what is there चारों ओर देखना
- 19. **Thick** (adjective) refers to the density of hair घने
- 20. **Grizzled** (adjective) (of hair) having dark and white hairs mixed. भूरी (दाढ़ी)
- 21. **Barrel** (noun) a cylindrical container bulging out in the middle, traditionally made of wooden staves with metal hoops round them. पीपा, बैरल

- 22. Hurry (verb) rush, hasten, speed, dash जल्दबाजी करना
- 23. **Stranger** (noun) outsider, newcomer, unknown, foreigner अजनबी
- 24. Echo (verb) resound, resonate, reverberate, ricochet, repeat गूंजना
- 25. **Thunder** (noun) roar, boom, rumble, bellow, resound गड़गड़ाहट
- 26. Gaze (noun)- stare, fixed look, intent look, gape टकटकी/ स्थिर नज़र
- 27. Frightened (adjective) scared, afraid, terrified, fearful, worried भयभीत/ डरा ह्आ
- 28. **Tremble** (verb) shake, quiver, shiver, shudder, quake कांपना
- 29. **Rub** (verb) Move over something with pressure मलना/ मसलना

- 30. Whistle (verb) Make whistling sounds; hiss, sing, flute सीटी बजाना
- 31. **Mutter** (verb) –Talk indistinctly; usually in a low voice बड़बड़ाना
- 32. **Descend** (verb) go down, come down नीचे उतरना
- 33. **Stroke** (verb) caress, touch, fondle, blow, apoplexy सहलाना
- 34. **Astonishment** (noun) surprise, amazement, wonder, bewilderment आश्चर्य
- 35. Walk up to (phrasal verb) To come up to someone on foot
- 36. For a Moment (phrase) A short time, a little bit एक पल के लिए
- 37. **Exclaim** (verb) To speak suddenly or sharply, as from surprise कुछ कहना, चिल्लाना



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
