The Bear Story – Part (i)

- 2. **Fond** (of) (adjective) liking a person or thing, or liking doing something बहुत पसंद करना
- Bring up (phrasal verb) look after a child until it is an adult. पालन-पोषण करना
- Slay (verb) kill, murder, slaughter, assassinate, butcher मारना
- 5. Paw (noun) foot, pad पंजा
- Amiable (adjective) friendly, agreeable, genial, affable, pleasant मिलनसार/स्शील
- 7. **Beast** (noun) An animal, especially a large or dangerous four-footed one
- 8. **Kennel** (noun) a small shelter for a dog. कुताघर
- 9. **Amicably** (adverb) agreeably, genially, friendly, affably, kindly सौहार्दपूर्ण ढंग से
- 10. **Graze** (verb) let feed in a field or pasture or meadow चरना

- 18. **Asleep** (adjective) sleeping, slumbering, snoozing, napping सोया हुआ
- 19. **Stump** (noun) the part of something such as a tree, tooth, arm, or leg that is left after most of it has been removed: टुकड़ा
- 20. **Tease** (verb) Annoy persistently चिढ़ाना, छेड़ना
- 21. **Often** (adverb) frequently, much, many times, repeatedly अक्सर


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- 22. **Appetite** (noun) hunger, desire, craving, thirst, longing भूख
- 23. **Autumn** (noun) the season of the year between summer and winter, lasting from September to November north of the equator and from March to May south of the equator, when fruits and crops become ready to eat and are picked, and leaves fall: शरद
- 24. **Wistful** (adjective) pensive, nostalgic, melancholy, longing, yearning उदास, चिन्तित
- 25. **Ripening** (adjective) become fully grown परिपक्व
- 26. Orchard (noun) A garden.
- 27. **Resist** (verb) withstand, oppose, defy, fight, confront विरोध करना, रोकना
- 28. **Temptation** (noun) lure, enticement, attraction, allurement, fascination ਪ੍ਰਕੀਮਰ

- 29. **Help oneself to** (phrase) to take some of what you want, without asking permission
- 30. **Handful** (noun) an amount of something that can be held in one hand: मुट्ठीभर
- 31. **Clumsy** (adjective) awkward, inept, bungling, bumbling, ungainly बेढंगा
- 32. **Try** (verb) Test, experiment with, check out
- 33. **Beehive** (noun) a container shaped like a box in which bees are kept so that their honey can be collected मध्मुखी का छत्ता
- 34. **Apt** (adjective) appropriate, fitting, suitable, proper, relevant उपयुक्त, उचित
- 35. **Somewhat** (adverb) To a small degree or extent कुछ हद तक
- 36. **No Wonder** (phrase) it is not surprising आश्चर्य की बात नहीं

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
