"Who says I'm bad?" said the Devil, indignantly.


"People," said Chinnu.

- 10. **Snort** (verb) exhale noisily, grunt, blow, scoff, puff – फुंकारना / नाक से जोर से हवा निकालना


- 11. **Unwrap** (verb) open, uncover, peel, remove covering, unveil – खोलना / खोलकर दिखाना
- 12. **Plantain** (noun) banana plant, cooking banana – कच्चा केला
- 13. **Trot up** to (phrase) jog toward, move briskly, run lightly, approach quickly तेज़ी से पास आना
- 14. **Settle down** (phrasal verb) sit down, relax, get comfortable, become still, rest – आराम से बैठना
- 15. **Pat** (verb) tap, touch lightly, caress, stroke, clap थपथपाना
- 16. **Scurry off** (phrasal verb) dash away, run quickly, scamper, rush off, hurry away दौड पडना / तेज़ी से भागना
- 17. **Pour out** (phrasal verb) emerge, stream out, gush, flow out, flood निकल पड़ना / उमड़ना
- 18. **Anthill** (noun) ant mound, ant colony, termite hill – चींटियों का ढेर
- 19. **Bask** (verb) sunbathe, lounge, relax, enjoy warmth, lie in the sun – धूप सेंकना
- 20. **Flick** (verb) snap, flip, jerk, swish, tap झटके से हिलाना / चमकाना

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- 21. **Barn** (noun) shed, stable, storehouse, granary, cowshed – गोदाम / पश्शाला
- 22. **In droves** (phrase) in large numbers, in crowds, in multitudes, in swarms, in flocks झूंड में / भारी संख्या में
- 23. **Snap** (verb) bite, snarl, crack, break suddenly, bark sharply काट खाना / झपटना
- 24. **Snarl** (verb) growl, roar, bark, snap, howl – गुरीना
- 25. **Growl** (verb) snarl, grunt, grumble, bark, rumble – गड़गड़ाना / गुरीना
- 26. **Bark** (verb) yelp, yap, growl, snarl, woof அர்க்சா

- 27. **Curse** (verb) swear, abuse, damn, blaspheme, cuss – गाली देना / शाप देना
- 28. **Bang away** (phrasal verb) fire repeatedly, shoot continuously, pound, thump, blast जोर-जोर से मारना
- 29. **Ruckus** (noun) commotion, uproar, chaos, disturbance, fuss शोरगुल / हंगामा
